Dear Mother,

Your letters of June 12 and 16. came today. The trip over was smooth so I was not sick although some were. We were about 2 weeks on the water. I have sent you several letters and field cards and to Myra also. I did not get your or her birthday packages but the letter you & she sent on May 12. came O.K. There were 14 fellows from our company at Humphrey to go to Stuart.

The \$3.00 allotment is only for March & April so May & June is due now I have been paid for the part of Feb. March, April and May. David Laing the boy I was with at Camp Dix and Humphrey is in this regiment but his company is not with us just now He & I were together on the boat. The farms look like American farms but the citrus I have been in do not look at all like those at home.

I did not get any pay until June so I have enough now.

We are allowed to write so

little in our letters that I really have nothing to tell you. It rains almost every day now, and it is cold for July. Wish you could find out where Terry Ketchum is and also the regiment that is coming. Price the civil engineer from Wilmington is in. I am well, hope that you and Dad are too.

Wonder if there are many visitors in old Atlantic City now?

Would like to hear what's going on there and to have a good swim.

Sure would like to see Spellman, but think it will be sometime before he gets here.
