Dear Mother

Am writing again
and in case you do not
receive my letter of July 13th
just want to say that I
received your letters of May
12th and of June 12th and
June 14th. It is warmer
now and suppose it is hot
home. I am well & hope
you are too. Am anxious
to hear from Spellman.
It sure is a pleasure to
receive mail from home
and wish that you
write every week or so.

am writing to Myra
today too.

Le Roy Jones must be near
me somewhere over here
as we passed some
Engineers who were in
the same division that
his regiment is in. I
think Harry Reeves & John
McBride are pretty lucky.

We get paid in French
money. Just got June's
pay 2 days ago.

a store keeper told
me that before the war
he could ^{buy} for one franc
(.20) chocolate that now

costs 10 francs or almost
\$2.00 I can buy eggs at
1/2 franc each and a
cup of milk for 6 cents. I
get lots of chocolate too.
