 are with you now. I wrote one

 to you. I have not seen any  
 fellows from A.C. but a new  
 fellow joined the company re-  
 cently from Humphreys. The  
 sun is shining now and it sure  
 seems good. Hope that had  
 is feeling better now and that  
 all are well as usual. Wish that  
 Myra would save all the Sat. Eve.  
 Post. so that I can read them  
 when I get back.
